PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

October 26, 2009

Goals

- 1. Provide drinking water information to the media and to the public throughout the year.
- 2. Investigate alternative methods of delivering public information.

Committee Membership

1. Anyone with an interest in providing public information.

Timeline / Deadlines

- 1. Submit committee report prior to board meetings held in January, March, May, July, September, November.
- 2. Submit budget request for the upcoming year at the November board meeting.

Deliverables / Activities

- 1. Distribute press release and/or public service announcements for Drinking Water Week.
- 2. Distribute press releases for the annual conference, award recipients, and other events/information, as needed.
- 3. Provide drinking water information to the media throughout the year (e.g. PSAs).
- 4. Post drinking water related events and information on the Nebraska Section facebook page.
- 5. Prepare for and conduct water tasting contest at annual conference.

Standard Procedures

- 1. Develop press releases for Drinking Water Week and the Fall Conference.
 - a. Write press release and submit to the Nebraska Press Association for distribution to all the newspaper, and broadcast (television and radio) outlets in the state.
 - b. Submit in April for Drinking Water Week (May) and mid-October for the fall conference (November).
 - i. Be prepared for inquiries from the media. Be prepared to accommodate the media if they wish to visit the fall conference.
 - ii. Send thank you notes to the reporters who cover the fall conference.
- 2. Develop press releases for award recipients.
 - a. After awards are presented at the fall conference (or any other time during the year), get award recipient names from Awards Committee Chair.
 - b. Send press release relating to each particular award and its recipient to newspapers in the community where the recipient lives/works.
- 3. Public Service Announcements
 - a. PSAs may be used for Drinking Water Week or any other time.
 - b. Obtain prerecorded PSAs from National AWWA or develop our own.
 - c. Copy PSAs onto CDs.
 - d. Prepare cover letter.
 - e. Send letter and a CD containing the PSAs to the 69 radio station groups in Nebraska.

Committee SOP

- 4. Post drinking water related events and information on the Nebraska Section facebook page.
 - a. Inform the fans of the Nebraska Section facebook page of upcoming events.
 - b. Periodically post general information on the page.
- 5. Prepare for and conduct water tasting contest at annual conference.
 - a. Receive approval from the Nebraska Section Board that a water tasting contest will be held at the fall conference (March).
 - b. Identify the panel of judges (June).
 - c. Invite judges and solidify the judging panel (July-October).
 - d. Contact Publications Chair about promoting the contest in the Wise Water Words (July).
 - e. Send a postcard reminder to utilities (mid-October) but the reminder may not be needed once the contest is established.
 - f. Order award from Awards Unlimited in Lincoln for the winner of the contest (October).
 - g. Obtain supplies (cups, crackers, etc) needed for the contest (October).
 - h. After the contest, send press release to the local media announcing the winner (November).

NEBRASKA'S WATER FUTURE IS ON THE TABLE IN KEARNEY, NOVEMBER 4th AND 5th

(Lincoln, NE) More than 400 of Nebraska's top water professionals will meet in Kearney November 4th and 5th to discuss the condition of the state's drinking water supplies and make plans to improve and preserve those resources for generations to come. The 2009 Fall Conference of the Nebraska Section – American Water Works Association (AWWA) will be held November 4 and 5 at the Holiday Inn, Kearney. AWWA is the premiere organization in the state dedicated to the delivery of safe drinking water to every community in Nebraska.

Conference attendees will be invited to participate in more than 20 different presentations, including natural disaster preparedness for water systems; the effect of water appropriations on endangered species on the Lower Platte River; and case studies in treatment and distribution at places like Broadwater, Seward, York and Lincoln. More than 50 vendors also will be on display, sharing the latest in equipment and methods to help protect the most precious resource on the planet.

New to the conference this year is a water-tasting contest for public water systems that brings a sample of drinking water from their municipal supply. The contest begins at 5 p.m., November 4, where a panel of judges will choose a winner that will be nominated to compete in the water-tasting competition at the National AWWA conference and exposition in Chicago, June 20-24, 2010. The state's young water professionals and college students also will be well-represented at the statewide conference, helping to place their mark today on the water issues they will be responsible for managing tomorrow.

The Fall Conference is a joint event, which includes the Nebraska Water Environment Association and the Nebraska Chapter of the American Public Works Association. These three organizations together represent more than 1,000 members working across business, industry, and the public sector to help ensure the quality and safety of the state's natural resources.
